Nalini Singh is the Executive Director of the Fiji Women's Rights Movement (FWRM). A feminist, human rights activist, and social development specialist, she has worked in key Asia Pacific women's organizations such as Asia Pacific Resource and Research Centre for Women (ARROW) in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and Asia Pacific Forum on women, Law and Development (APWLD) in Chiangmai, Thailand. She is also a member of Asia Pacific Women's Watch (APWW).



Yukiko Oda is a Vice-Convenor of Japan Women's Watch, an advocacy organization with special focus on the implementation of the Beijing Platform for Action and other international documents. She is co-facilitator of the Gender Unit of the Japan Society Network on SDGs. An advocate for gender and the environment, she is a member of the Advisory Committee for Environmental and Social Considerations for the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA).





Farida Shaheed is the Executive Director of Shirkat Gah Women's Resource Center in Pakistan and founding member of the Pakistan women's rights network, Women's Action Forum (WAF), and a member of the transnational feminist network, Women Living Under Muslim Laws (WLUML). She was appointed the first UN independent Expert in the field of cultural rights in 2009 and served as Special Rapporteur on the same issue from 2012 to 2015.

Aurora de Dios is Senior Project Director of the Women and Gender Institute (WAGI) in the Philippines, where she was Executive Director for 10 years. A leading advocate for women's human rights, she has served as Chair of the National Commission on the Role of Filipino Women, member of the UN Committee on the Elimination of All forms of Discrimination Against Women (UNCEDAW), and Philippine representative to the ASEAN Commission on the Promotion and Protection of Women and Children's Rights
